Meeting of February 22nd, 2022

We had 18 members present by ZOOM

Business:

1) The **Bike Sale** situation: Keith reported that he had tentatively arranged **Saturday April 30th** for an in person bike sale at the Keystone. The setup would, as usual be the previous day on Friday the 29th. Keith has our usual auctioneer on tap for the sale.

The *People's Marketplace* building has been sold to the current lease holder. He is quite willing to continue to allow us use of the building but moving the room we use to the very front room.

There are about 180 bikes available. Keith may arrange a bike repair session before the sale. The bikes for auction may be selected for best return and the remaining could be sold to our frequent bulk buyer.

2) Fund Raising and the Coupon Book Sale. D'Arcy and Doug reported that there were about 315 still in inventory. Having some renewal of the restrictions for COVID probably slowed sales but we can continue to sell what we have. They are good until the end of the year. A couple of suggestions were made to put the books in front of people including at the bike sale. The financial result looks very good but I usually do not put reported dollar values in the bulletin.

3) Meeting Location: After the middle of March we will resume meeting in person at Seniors for Seniors. Note below that **the next meeting on March 8th is by ZOOM but then the Business meeting of March 22nd is at Seniors for Seniors.**

The University is going to keep its COVID policy unchanged (and presumably the dining room policy) until the end of term to avoid constant reshuffling of arrangements.

4) Frank gave a report on the East End Playground situation. The committee has a tentative date of **June 4th for a grand opening** with food sales. They will replace one of the swing sets on the old swings that were left in place as well as some additional items for the playground and maybe lights. Arrangements for completing the shelters continue.

5) Frank suggested we abandon the poster distribution for the Keystone as a fund raiser. He will give the Keystone time to find an alternate. A motion was passed to make that official.

5) Treasurers report. Reg gave a brief report on the current finances. Again, I leave out dollar amounts. The numbers are given at the meetings. The club is basically on budget given the adjustments that have had to be made for COVID effects.
